- Assist in making EB a great place to be via volunteer coordination and services like hot lunch
- Build community between EB families
- As part of the community building we offer sessions that are helpful to parents of school age students
- Meetings tend to be informal to facilitate discussion and connections
- Update from School Administration
- Including Review of RVS Satisfaction Survey
- 6) School Update EB school Administration Susan Parker/Veronica Hooper
 - Safety Students should know all staff (adults) in the building
 - Welcome back ceremony at the beginning of school involved songs, staff introductions, a video from Susan Parker's dog, etc. and lasted about 20 minutes
 - Learning Support Mindful Moments (after lunch and recesses)
 - AB Education classes within designated sizes, no extra teachers
 - Hired Jamie Rogers Educational Assistant

- Day starts at 8:55am with music playing for gentle entry. 9:00am students enter, 9:05am music ends. Lunches shortened to 15 minutes to accommodate extra recess in the afternoon. School ends at 3:35pm.
- Communication of Student Learning Real Time Reporting (Power School) paired with My Blue Print, which are custom tailored to Rocky View schools. Real-Time-Reporting using Powerschool and the online portfolio system My Blueprint. This will shift reporting on student progress to a system where parents are able to check their child(ren)'s progress online at any time instead of using a delayed "snap shot" of student progress that is part of a paper report card.EB website has the Parent Guide to Real-Time Reporting (icon at top of page) and parent training sessions will be provided during Student-Led Conferences.
- Rocky View Student Council Guide Book
- Goal Setting for EB staff with Jeff Couillard and Kelly Waters-Radcliffe (Responsive Educators)
- The process of revising the school's logo, vision and mission has begun. Parent feedback will be requested as one of the next steps in the process. Final draft of mission statement proposed for November 2018.
- EB Resources available:
 - Response to Intervention (RTI) bring in substitute teachers every 6-8 weeks and all teachers meet to discuss
 - Art Expression Program
 - Literacy Specialists and assistants available in French and English for every child. In the spring, Literacy Specialists move into Kindergarten classes to evaluate (early intervention).
 - Numeracy support
 - Social/Emotional Child Development support via Advisors
 - Music teachers

- Pit Stop uses "buddy system" and is an alternate workspace
- Physical resources including rockers, chair bands, stationary bikes, noise cancelling headphones, exercise balls, etc.
- Tool Box (sensory) room
- Learning Commons Manjusha Naidu (Librarian)
- Maker Space similar to a miniature Telus Sparks Centre
- 7) Board Update Fiona Gilbert
 - 50+ schools opened September 2018 for over 1000 children. Final enrolment numbers not determined until end of September 2018, not available until beginning of October 2018.
 - Flood damage at Chestemere Prince of Peace School, so opening postponed. Students spent first two weeks at a nearby empty school.
 - Alberta Government changes to regulations:
 - School Council
 - ECS
 - Student Records
 - Private Schools
 - Transportation regulations are not yet official. Timeline of autumn -December 2018 for changes in regulation and will be in effect December 2019.
 - New Kindergarten to Grade 4 curriculum effective September 2019. Refer to AB Education website for further details.

- Four-Year School Education Plan 2019-2023 initiated. Indicated RVS will be asking for parental feedback. A presentation with more details is planned at an upcoming school council meeting. (Details will follow via the school newsletter and class reps).
