6) Administration Update - Gerry Gaudet and Elisa Korver

- A big thank you to everyone for making time to join us
- Recap: Staggered entry September 1st and 2nd was successful as far as reducing traffic congestions, building teacher/student relationships, less stress on children, etc.
- Open House on August 31st great to see so many people out and everyone seemed happy to be able to reconnect with other parents in the community

- Meet the Teacher 6:00pm and 6:45pm on September 22nd
- Demographics 4 new registrations this week, 480 students (K04) in 22 classes. Lower Kindergarten numbers than last year. Grade 1&2 classes are higher than last year and higher than projected. Grade 3&4 class numbers are static. Recommended class sizes are K-1 (19-23); Grades 2-3 (23-27); and Grade 4 (25-29). We've got Grade 2 English classes at 30 and 29 and a Grade 1 class at 24. Everyone else falls within the guidelines. French Immersion is at 43% and English is at 57%.
- Welcome to new staff Mr. Lawson-Grade 1, Mrs. Sargent-Grade 2, Mrs. Spooner-Grade 3&4, Mrs. Harvey-music teacher (part-time).
- Farewell to Mrs. Chrome who moved away
- In the process of hiring learning assistants
- Terry Fox Run on Friday, September 23rd 9:30-10:00am families welcome to join students and classes, please do not bring small children, dogs or strollers
- Truth and Reconciliation on September 30th no classes. EB will recognize this day with students on September 29th with "orange shirt day". Truth & Reconciliation committee to plan events throughout the week, there is also a community event walk at 11:00am starting at McDougall to Morley
- First concert of the year will be for Grade 3 on October 27th
- Implementing new curriculum work in embedded collaborative time, divisional professional learning, etc.
- Year 4 of RVSD 4-year plan focus on: 1. student engagement, 2. inclusion, 3. instructional practices, 4. make learning visible
- September 29th parent engagement sessions at 9:30am with reminder sent out in the Friday Fan-out
- Literacy tutors this will be starting up soon and parent volunteers are welcome. Contact Maxine Wilton for further information.

7) School Board Update - Fiona Gilbert

- The Boards is committed to having trustee come to school council meetings and listen to parents. Provide updates from a divisional level.
- School council is a legislative role, and every school must have one. They act in an advisory capacity to admin. and the board. School Council executive board meetings, October 6th - council chair and board, - anyone interested can attend. Membership in ASCA (Alberta School Councils' Association) is paid for.
- Positivity in the schools is great to see. No real covid protocols in place anymore has been a positive change. End of August welcome back breakfast for school staff.
- Some classes a bit bigger than we like them to be for various reasons. Some schools (not EB) are at capacity around 4% growth finding space can be a challenge.

- Buildings and facilities and maintenance/operations staff busy during the summer. Taking big spaces and splitting into 2 or more smaller spaces (densification).
- Short school bus drivers, we continue to work with Southland to get more drivers. Parents encouraged to check the app. to make sure the bus is on time.
- Looking ahead school council chair orientation on October 6th (online), strategic planning engagement survey info. Gathered in May, data has been worked through and reporting back on results in October. 2 weeks to provide feedback.
- October 27th -Joint Board School Council meeting in person in Airdrie.
- In 2026 RVSD will be over 100% capacity in all schools, so space is an issue (85% capacity is where you want to be).
- Provincial survey from ministry of education on professional code of conduct for teachers. New curriculum K-3 in place, 4-6 in progress. Still a chance to give feedback on this. 2024 expected to be in place. <u>https://www.alberta.ca/new-teacher-code-of-conduct-engagement.aspx</u>
- New premier in October, possibly new education minister. Hopefully public education is a top list priority.

Question from the Floor:

Fiona .G. - What are your thoughts on staggered entry?

K.F.-I am for it. C.R.-It was nice to have smaller groups and less traffic. C.B.-It was nice to avoid traffic congestion. A.W.-Was left scrambling to find childcare for the other day. A bit chaotic and don't really understand why. Made sense during Covid but not as much now. More advance notice would be nice. Doesn't make as much sense for kids in after school care, as it threw off the routine. R.S.-increased anxiety knowing friends wouldn't be attending on their staggered entry day. E.S.-see benefit in smaller class sizes. R.L.-Appreciate the "gentler" entry for the kids. N.P.-liked staggered entry as a parent and a teacher. Gentle entry is calmer, smaller group for bonding, calming and order. Helped decompress kids before going into a full week. Nice introduction before routine begins.

8) Update from EB Fundraising Committee (Gerry .G. on behalf of Jakki .M.)

 We (Jakki and Gerry) met last Friday and discussed the summer casino - will find out \$ amount in November and will figure out what to spend \$ on. Looking at outdoor space (esp. west side of school) to upgrade, playground still good for at least 5 years, feedback from grounds crew is that the playground is well maintained and in good condition. The funds need to be spent within 2 years from casino date. <u>Question from the Floor:</u> A.W.-Will playground accessibility be a concern the next time it's replaced? Gerry .G.-Yes, this is the trend for sure.
